DIRECTOR STATEMENT

For over 40 years, The Blue Bench has connected survivors to the critical, lifesaving resources and services they deserve.

With the unwavering support of our community, The Blue Bench meets survivors where they are and provides space for them to work toward healing, thriving, and self-sufficiency.

Thanks to our donors, volunteers, staff, and community partners, we continue to build a culture of safety and healing to put an end to sexual violence. Every day I am grateful to work alongside determined advocates, dedicated to the well-being and growth of survivors.



In our 40th year of service, we are proud to say our work did not go unrecognized. In 2023:

- The Blue Bench won the Partners in Philanthropy award from The Denver Business Journal, honoring our unwavering commitment to serving and supporting our incredible community.
- The Blue Bench won the Social Media Excellence Award from CCASA. This award recognizes our dedication to dispelling myths about sexual violence, breaking the silence surrounding this crime, and providing survivor-centered coverage of sexual violence and related topics.
- With support from new donors and foundations, we have built robust programs, expanded our community education strategy, and employed qualified professionals who reflect the diversity of today's community.
- Community partners strengthened our mission across Metro Denver. Major events like our second-annual RISE Survivor Art Show featuring 30 local artists, our 40th Anniversary celebration, and Change on Tap highlighted how businesses can support survivors.

In 2023, we grew our community, implemented new programs, and reached hundreds more survivors. You can read more about our impact further in our annual report.



DIRECTOR STATEMENT

Nonetheless, the tumultuous atmosphere of the nation's economy and the confirmed 45% cut from the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) federal grant puts our organization and mission in danger.

Without our legislative leaders prioritizing crime victim services, we fear for the future of survivors and our communities. Without adequate access to resources, survivors face a host of harms including chronic illnesses, depression, anxiety, suicide, food and housing insecurity, absenteeism from work, and academic difficulties.


We urge you to take action by contacting your local representative and requesting their support for <u>Prop KK</u>.

The Blue Bench is grateful for the community of artists who came together and created bonds to last a lifetime.















